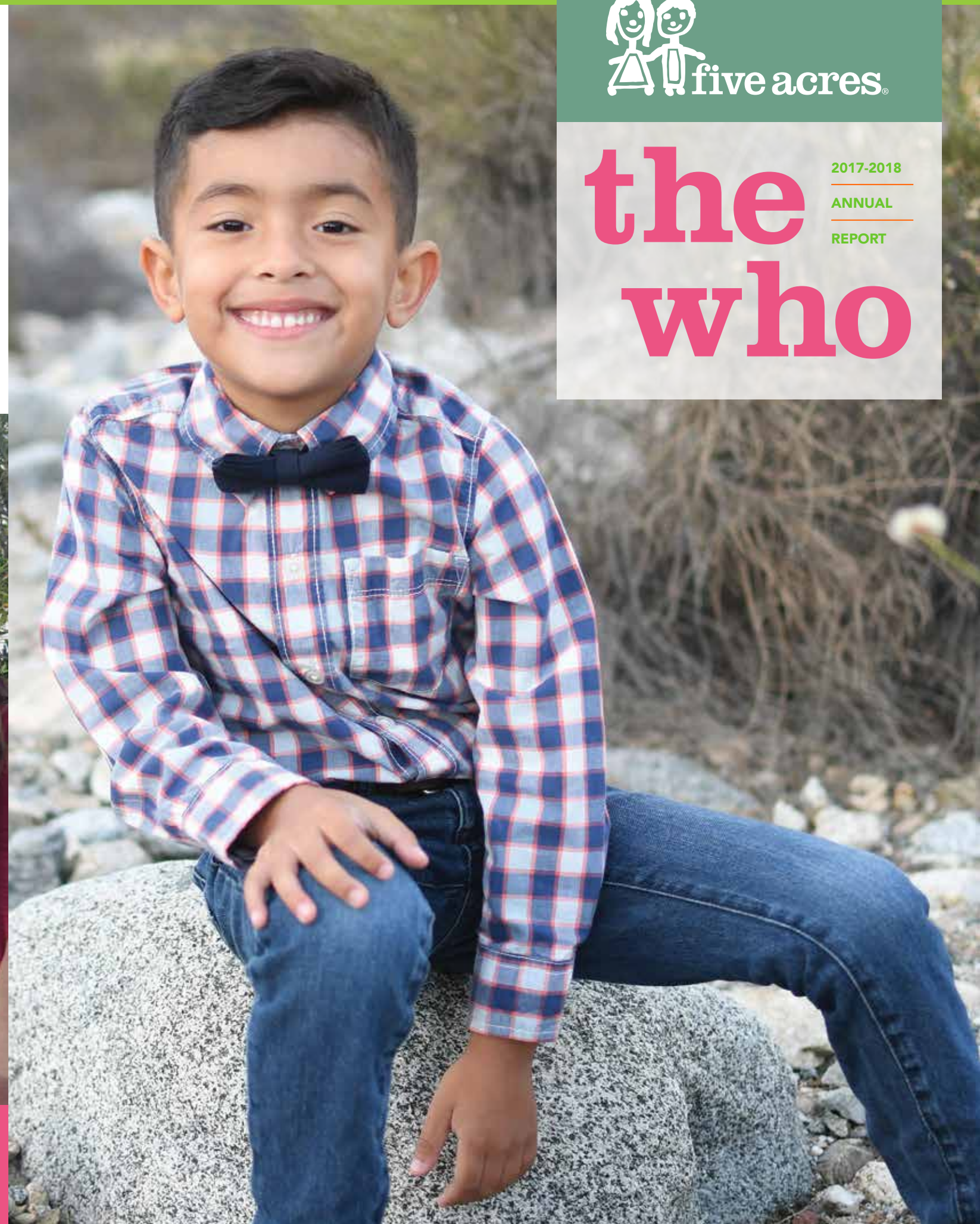

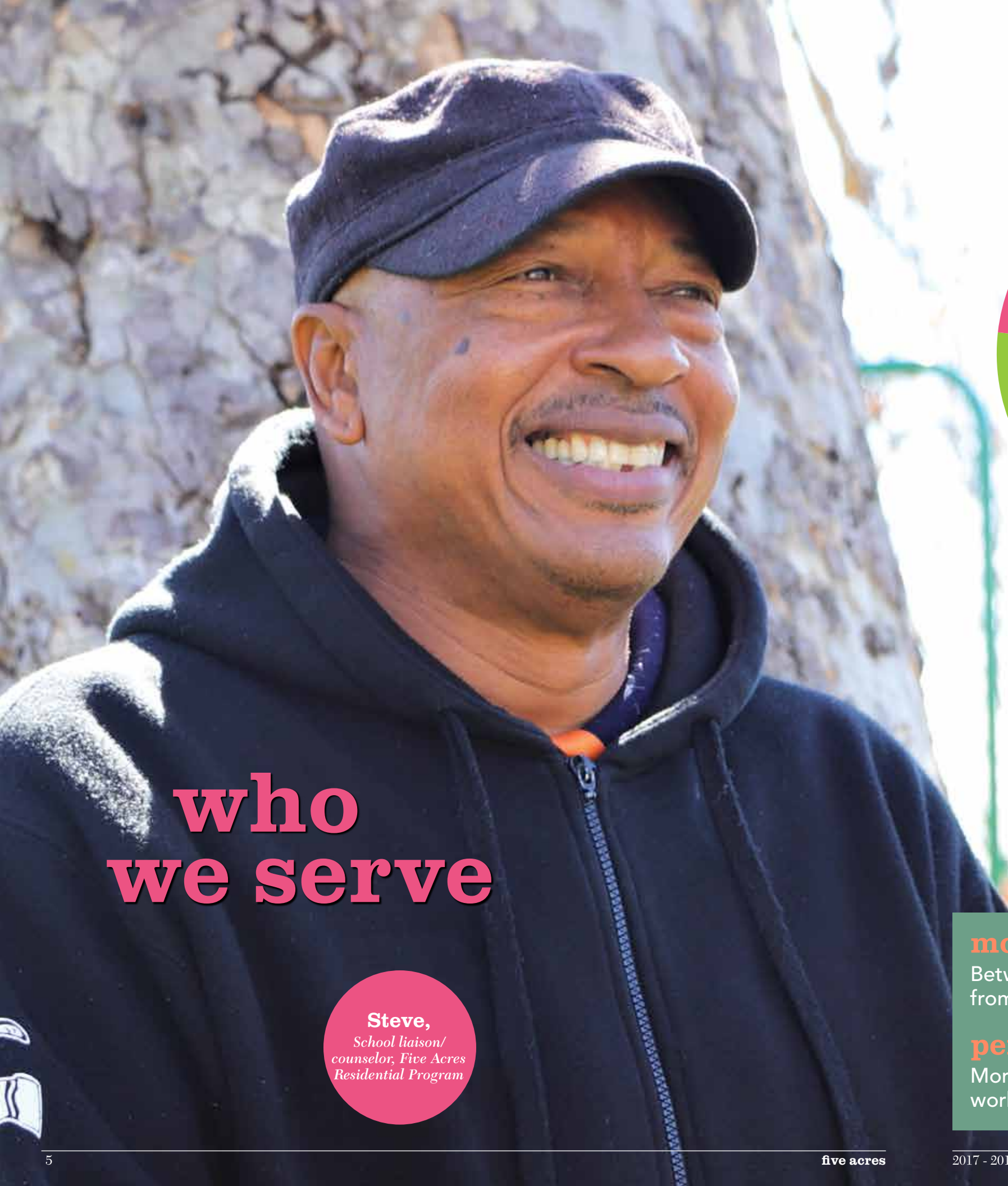
## **prevention**

## **permanency**

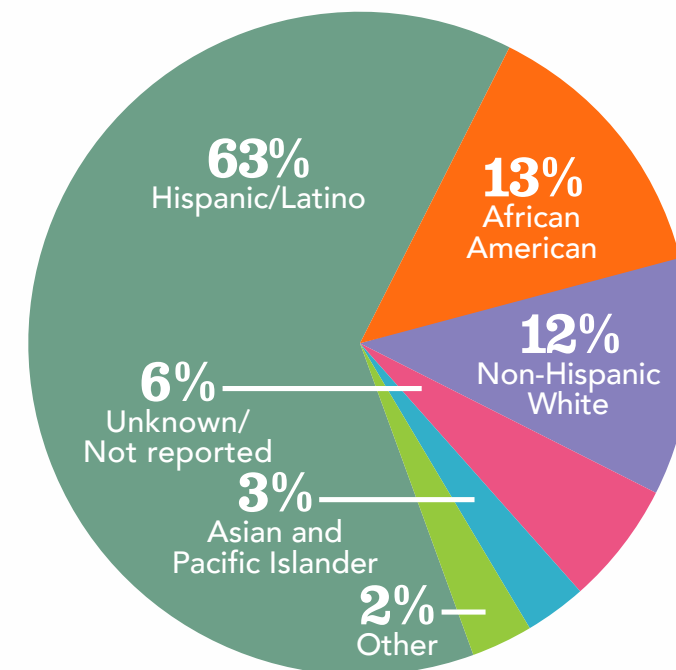
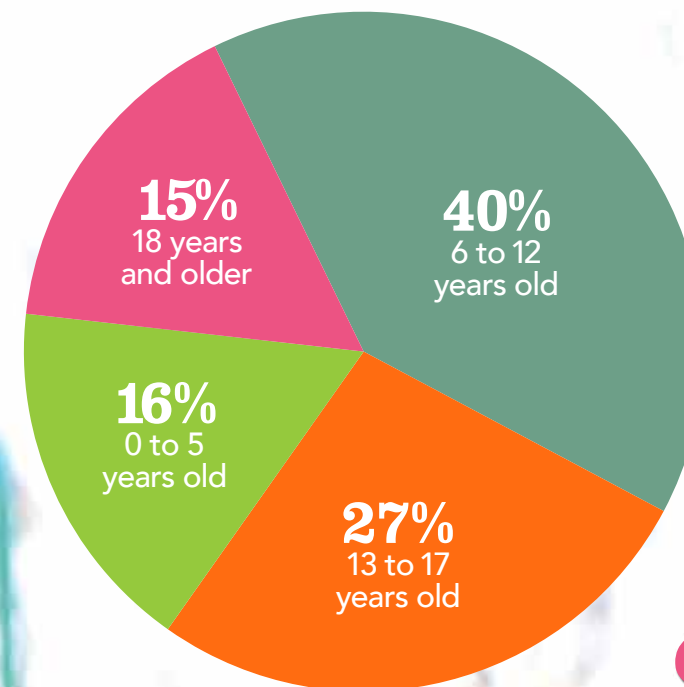
Five Acres' permanency services create loving, permanent families for children in need through foster care, adoption and mentor support for families going through the adoption process.

"The first thing I remember feeling when I came to Five Acres as a child of five or six was relief. My two younger brothers and I had been placed in foster care at least two other times, and in each instance they separated us. Five Acres was the first place that took all three of us together.

I entered the system because my father was abusive. My mom ultimately divorced him, and for years my brothers and I were in and out of foster care. But she never, ever stopped working to get us back. We weren't permanently reunified with her until I was eleven—and by then she had stabilized her life, set up a home with everything ready for us and was in a healthy relationship with a man who would become the person I call 'dad' today. And that was it—after six years, we were finally home.

During our time in foster care, my siblings and I went through so much trauma thinking we were at fault—but I understand it differently now. It is never the child's fault. And for other families struggling with abuse or mental health issues, I can't say how much of a difference it can make having a neutral third party, like the therapists at Five Acres, to talk to.

It took me about 30 years, but I finally made my way back to Five Acres. The night before, the words 'Five Acres' kept flashing through my mind. I started Googling online and saw there was a job fair at the Altadena campus the next day. I met with Liz, Five Acres' CPO, and told her my story in tears. She was the first to open her arms to me and say 'Welcome back.'

We toured the campus and it all came rushing back to me—where I brushed my teeth, getting ice cream in the neighborhood, running out on the lawn—quick snippets, but every memory had a smile in it. I met Sue and she asked me if I would be interested in joining The Alliance (Five Acres' new young professionals and volunteer guild) and that was the point I knew why God had called me here. Because there are still kids out there who are hurting, separated from their families, dealing with so much more than they should. They need someone to say, 'This is not your fault. Talk to me. Let me help you.' That's why I'm here—to give back."

"Jessica and I have worked with orphans internationally for years, and we've seen how much trauma is caused when children don't have families. Through one of our annual mission trips, we had started the process of adoption that unfortunately fell through—but during that time we learned that Five Acres offered home study for foster-adoption. We had heard about Five Acres around the neighborhood, and had friends who were connected to the agency, so we decided to reach out.

We talked with Ivon in the Permanency division, and it was kind of funny because after asking all of our questions, she said, 'Well, we have an orientation this weekend where I'll be answering a lot of these questions. Why don't you come?'

So we did. And immediately after that, she told us, 'We start foster family certification next weekend! Why don't you come to that, too?'

So within two weeks, we were going through the process of becoming certified foster parents. In training, what shocked us most was learning the sheer number of children in the system—more than 20,000 in Los Angeles County alone. We came to understand that all these kids need is love and a stable home, and we thought, 'We've got that. We can provide that.'

Five Acres helped us through the process quickly because there was one particular little boy in need of permanent placement. We started training in September 2018, and by that December James was with us. He was just beginning to walk, and his coming home to us represented a total 180 degree change

to our lives. The other foster families with Five Acres became a great resource to us. They're all going through the same thing, and are incredibly willing to share their knowledge and support. That's one of the biggest things about working with Five Acres—they're more than an organization, they're a community. And that's a beautiful thing.

Some people may be afraid to foster because of the trauma these kids have experienced, or they might be afraid of getting attached. But we saw that as a win. If we get attached, that means we're doing our jobs as a loving foster family. And if we could share anything with those who are considering fostering, it would be that kids are resilient. Where there is nurturing, stability, attention and love, they can get through nearly anything."

## client stories

**Deontay and Gloria,**

"Trust is of number one importance to me. When Deontay first came to Five Acres because of some behavioral challenges he was having, I met with his therapist Lillian and I felt that trust—it was immediate. She treated the children with respect, but was also real with them.

As my great-nephew, Deontay came to me as a baby when his mother (my

niece) was unable to care for him. As he got older, I knew I needed support to help him overcome his anger. Since he's been at Five Acres, we meet for family therapy regularly, and I've already seen a big change in him. There are less behavioral struggles and he's more self-aware. It's not about looking for perfection, but working towards consistency and long-term change as a family so he can thrive at home.

Kids are in the foster care system for all kinds of reasons, and it's so important for the community to know that. Deontay is here at Five Acres to get the support he needs so he can learn to choose a better life for himself, to know there are opportunities open to him. One of his goals is to be able to see the goodness in himself, and I know he'll get there."

"I thought my prospects of being a mom had passed me by. I was 41, unmarried and with no plans to be otherwise. But it was my sister who encouraged me by saying that just because I was single didn't mean I couldn't have a family. She connected me with a couple she knew who had also fostered through Five Acres—and I ultimately decided to complete the training and get my home ready for a child in need.

As it happened, I was traveling in Fatima, Spain when I got the call—a baby boy, just a few days old, likely in need of a permanent adoptive family. I got down on my knees and prayed, 'Should I say yes? Is this too fast?' But I knew in my heart that baby would be my son.

Hurricane Sandy tried to stop me, but eventually I got home to Christopher. I was so jet-lagged I stayed up all night, rocking him in the bassinet by my bed! And the next few years were just as bumpy—there were several long and trying years before our adoption day. But I'll never forget what he said when it was final.

'Mom, you're a Carillo, right?' he asked, 'and I'm a Carillo now, right?' I answered yes to both—and he yelled, 'So then we're BOTH Carillos!'

He might have only been three and a half, but he grasped the idea of family.

Now Christopher's in kindergarten, reading at a first grade level, acting in commercials and just absolutely thriving. He's such a sweet, special kid; super caring, super thoughtful. I've made the decision to be open with him about adopting him, and it's something that he proudly shares with others. I think it's because he understands how loved he is: wanted, chosen, and embraced completely by my entire family as one of our own."



# mid-strategic plan changes and developments

## strategic plan

In 2016, Five Acres launched an audacious 4-year strategic plan to continue to lead the pathway to permanency in LA. By mid-point, we've made significant strides towards our goals:

- **Financial Vitality:** We are at 18% of our 20% mid-strategic plan revenue increase goal
- **Workforce Wellness:** We are currently at 73% of our 80% target on the Best Companies ranking
- **Business IQ:** Completed 100% of our Business IQ projects for years 1 and 2
- **Cause Awareness:** Exceeded our target of 20% growth with social media at 22% increase and corporate volunteers up by 50%

## changes and developments

- Thanks to the generosity of Rich Webster and the Helen and Will Webster Foundation; Pasadena Community Foundation; and Jane and Doug Krech and the Tsutayo Ichioka and Satsuki Nakao Charitable Foundation, we completed multiple safety enhancements and renovations to our children's cottages, health center and main campus.
- To address the growing number of children entering foster care, we hired a new Chief Program Officer of Prevention and intensified our outreach in private health care. We now serve families in 8 private health care locations across LA to keep families together.
- In 2018, we became one of the few Short Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP) certified agencies in LA. We were instrumental in the STRTP pilot program that ultimately made it California law to reduce the length of time children live in group homes and to require a therapeutic component in their care. While STRTP should help children find permanency faster, it means we need more loving foster parents than ever before.

Most of Five Acres' funding comes from highly restricted government contracts that don't always cover everything our clients need. Your charitable support is the game changer that empowers special programs to enhance our mission of permanency.

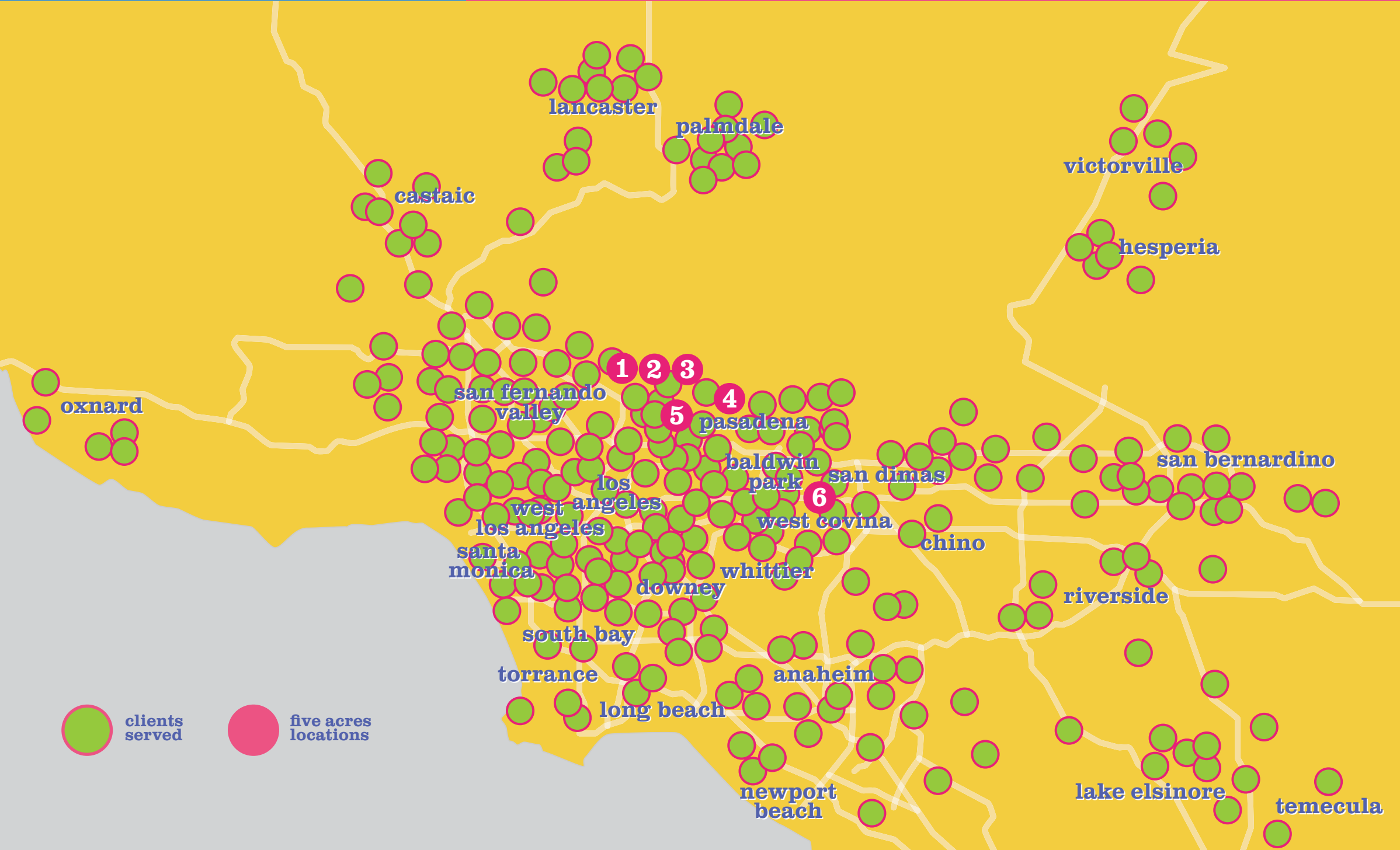

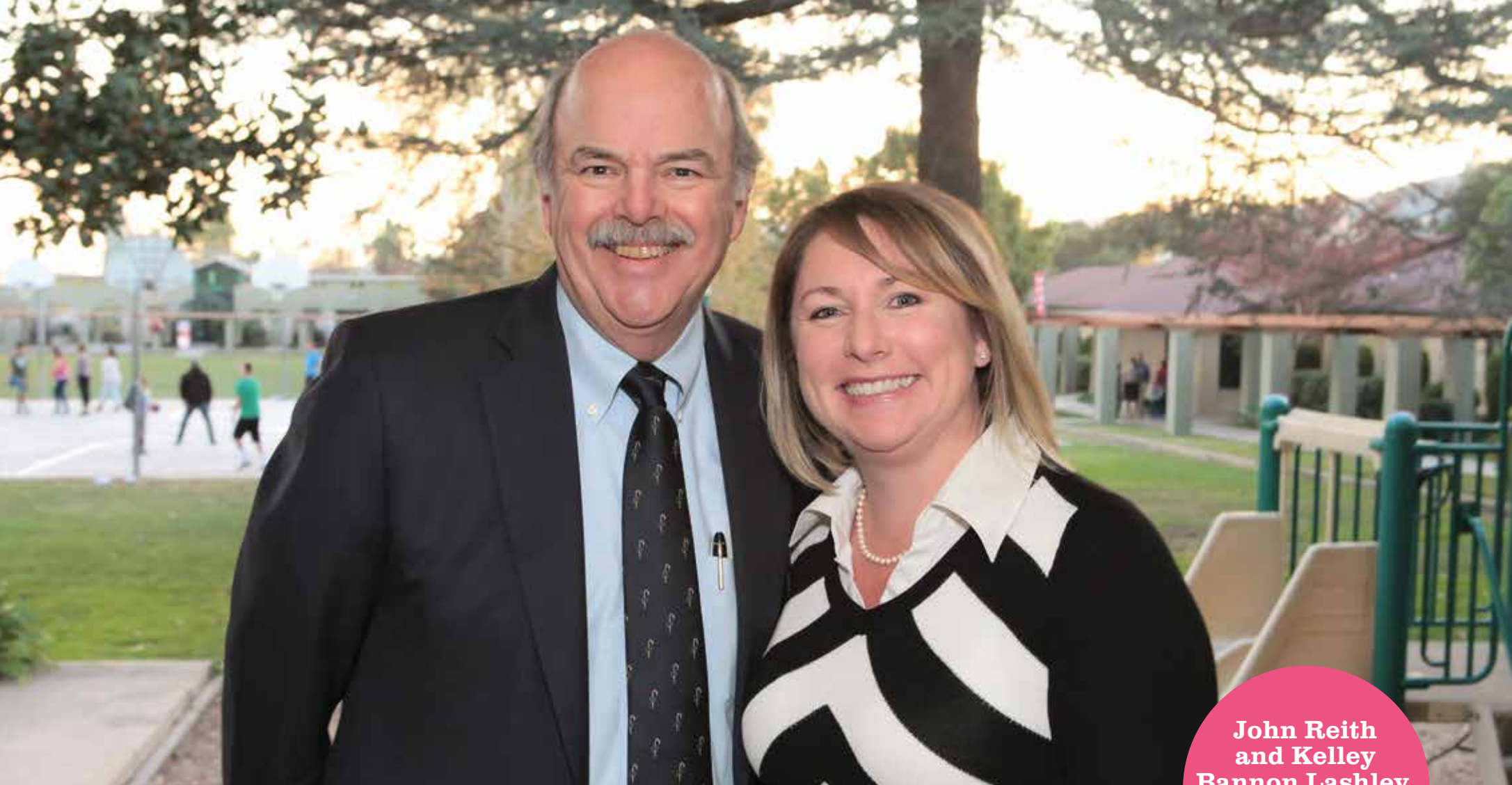
