Dear Friends,

Each year we ask, what more can we be doing? What could our communities look like if we prevented even more families from breaking apart? What could be the futures of children who found forever families? When we reflect on our 2018-2019 year, we expanded the vision of our commitment to serve thousands of kids and their families. There are nearly 442,000 children in foster care nationwide of which about 21,000 are in Los Angeles County. This year we expanded our reach to a sixth county so we can serve more kids in need and their families. Now in Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, Ventura, and Kern Counties, we fulfill our mission to promote safety, well-being and permanency for children and their families by building on their strengths and empowering them within their communities.

We experienced expansion of our programs, reaching more than 10,000 children and their families annually, focusing on their safety, well-being and permanency. We successfully provided permanent family solutions to 83% of children who received our services. In addition, we engaged others in expanding their vision of what it means to be committed to our mission and leave a legacy.

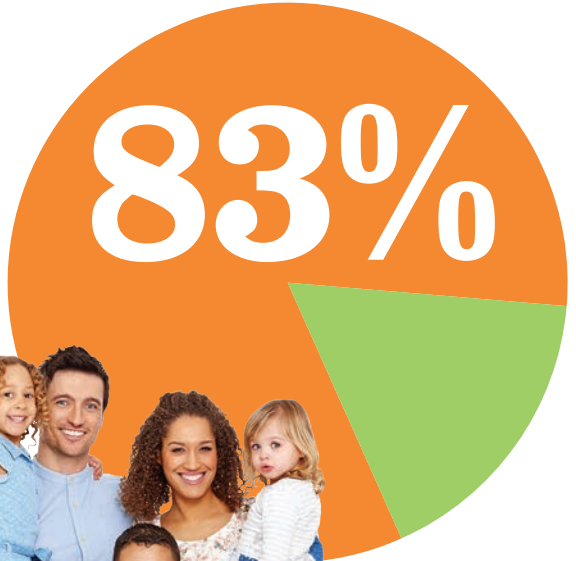

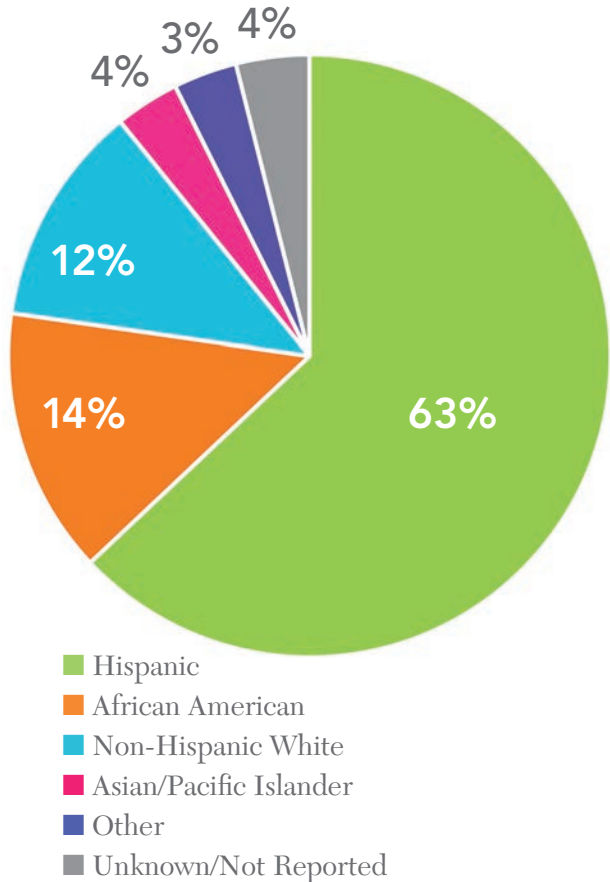
# who we serve

## Our mission

Five Acres promotes safety, well-being and permanency for children and their families by building on their strengths and empowering them within communities.

## Our services

### Residential

Every child should be raised by a loving family. Yet, when a child experiences acute trauma at home, living outside the home and within residential care is sometimes the best place to support children and families during the reunification process. At Five Acres, we provide short-term therapeutic homes for these children to restore balance, rebuild trust and reunify them with their families or connect them to loving foster-adopt families.

### Prevention

Preventing children from entering the foster care system is key to curbing Los Angeles’ growing foster care and homelessness crisis. Five Acres’ prevention services support families in the community by sending mental health and behavioral health specialists into the homes of children, youth and families.

### Permanency

Five Acres actively strives to provide stability by connecting children to safe, permanent and loving families. Our permanency services create loving homes for children in need through foster care, adoption and mentor support for families going through the adoption process. Community Based Services provide one-on-one, short-term intervention for youth and individualized mental health services to children, youth and their families.

## Expanding our impact

Five Acres continues to serve more children and families. In 2018-2019, we impacted the lives of 10,234 children and their families.





### Expanding safety

In 2018-2019, the typical child arriving at Five Acres had 28% more safety concerns compared to the previous year. Despite this increase, we successfully addressed more safety concerns with our clients compared to that previous year.

## expanding safety

The safety concerns of kids entering our residential program are increasing. This was the case for 11-year-old Trevor\* and 9-year-old James\*, who both experienced severe abuse by their stepfather. To keep them safe, their mom placed the boys in foster care while she escaped from her husband.

Determined to get her sons back, she enrolled in parenting classes to learn new skills and tips to improve their relationship. She found housing to provide a stable and comfortable home then applied for financial assistance during this transition. To help her boys heal, she began family therapy with them.

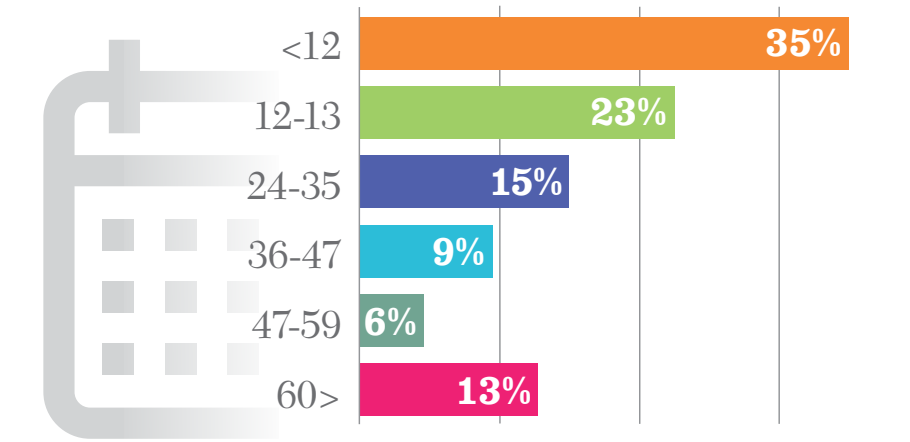
Mom's commitment was evident by her participation in their treatment, the loving nature in her gestures and her resolve to create a safe environment for all of them. After six months, the three were reunited and the boys were transitioned back home. To reinforce the positive gains the boys made at Five Acres, a therapeutic behavioral specialist and aftercare clinician supported the family.

# expanding well-being

For young girls, low self-esteem can be a struggle as they journey to adulthood. Now add the experience of trauma and family stressors and for any young girl, we can see how the impact could be devastating. Fortunately for 12-year-old Samantha\*, Five Acres was there to support her and the family.

At a young age, Samantha was exposed to domestic violence and her father's alcohol abuse, which significantly impacted her well-being and safety. Most recently, her father moved out of the home and left her mother as the sole provider for Samantha and her younger brother. Samantha began to experience low self-esteem and

depressive symptoms by withdrawing and isolating herself from friends and family due to the trauma and added home stressors.

In partnership with the school, administrators referred Samantha to Five Acres' Community Based Program due to missing a significant amount of school days,

which caused her expulsion from school. Having been moved to independent studies, Samantha's depression worsened. Samantha initially had a difficult time engaging in mental health services. With the encouragement and support she received from her therapist and her mother, she is now actively engaged in services and has been steadily improving in her well-being and her participation in school.

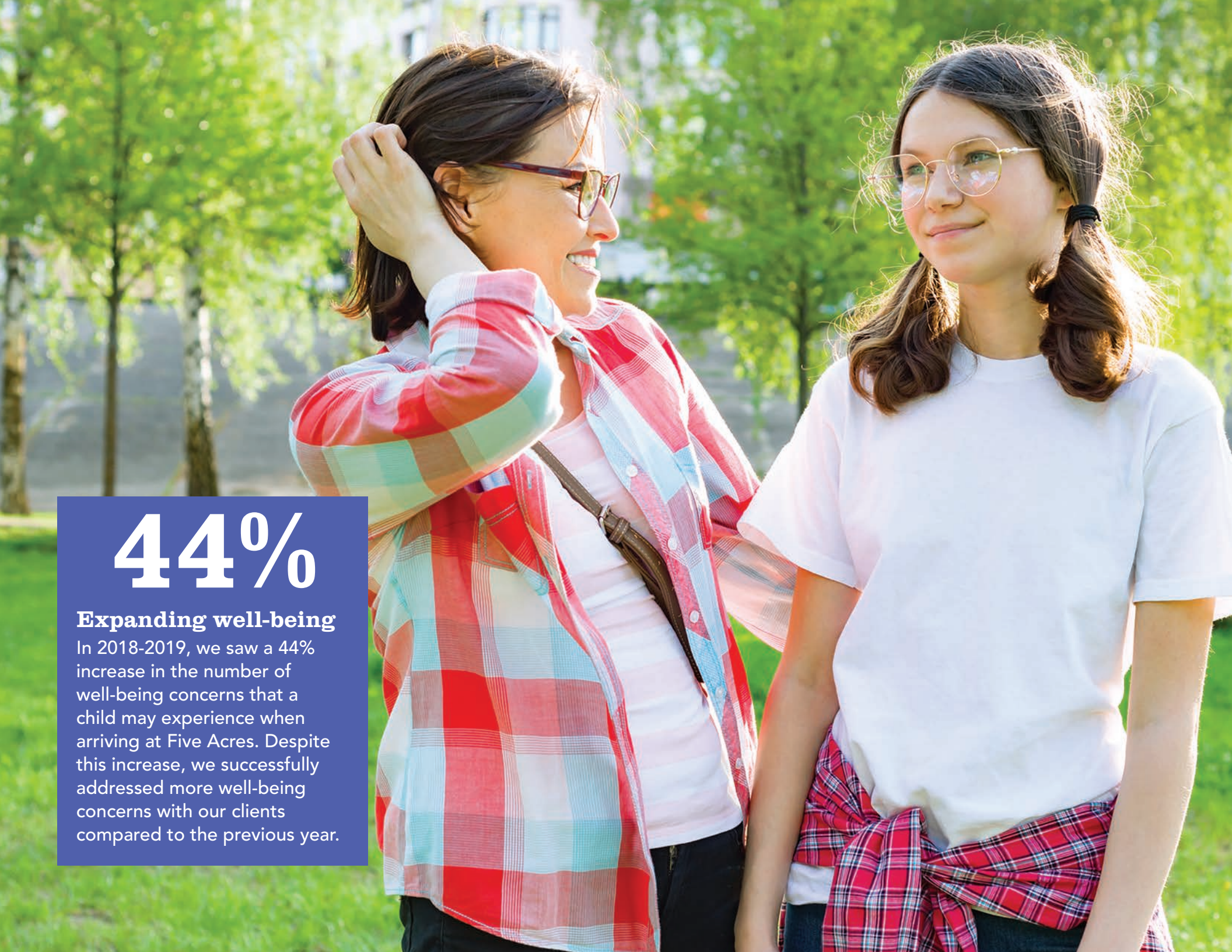
With the help of the Five Acres' team and her network of support, Samantha also enrolled in boxing class. This positive outlet helped improve her self-esteem, empowering and boosting her spirits. With Samantha's positive progress in therapy and school, her mother's worry and stress about Samantha's well-being has been eased. Samantha is a testament to how our mental health intervention has helped the family begin the healing process.

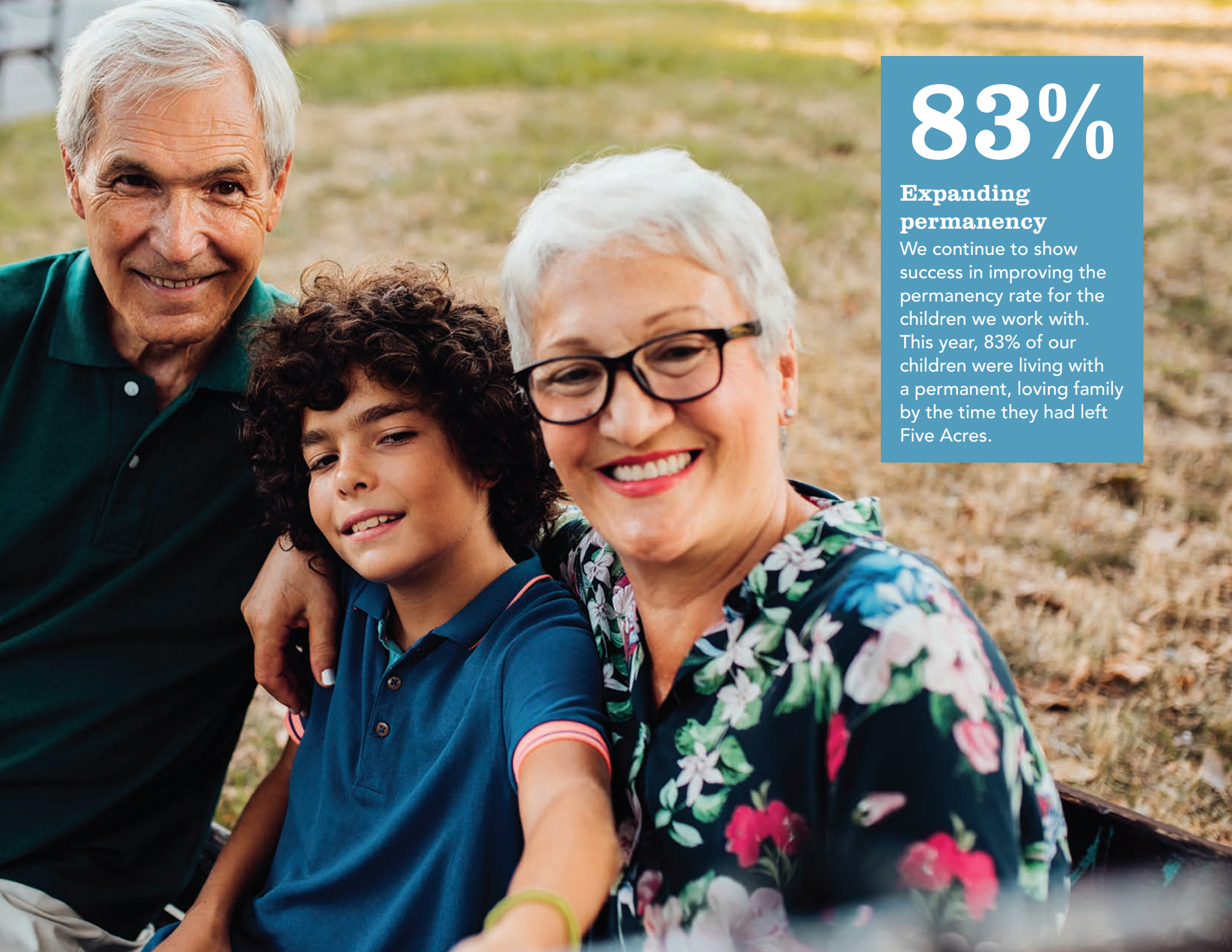

In 2018-2019, we saw a 44% increase in the number of well-being concerns that a child may experience when arriving at Five Acres. Despite this increase, we successfully addressed more well-being concerns with our clients compared to the previous year.

## Expanding permanency

We continue to show success in improving the permanency rate for the children we work with. This year, 83% of our children were living with a permanent, loving family by the time they had left Five Acres.

## expanding permanency

Relatives of children who enter foster care are the first individuals social workers reach out to for support. When Kevin\* entered the system, his paternal grandmother and grandfather stepped in to provide a loving home. Kevin was removed from his biological mother's care at birth for testing positive for substances. Kevin's biological father has a history of incarcerations and drug use, so he was unable to care for him.

After 10 years, Kevin's grandparents became overwhelmed with his hyperactive and impulsive nature, even missing work to address Kevin's behavioral issues at home and school. Work absences caused financial difficulties and added stress to the entire family. They reached out to Five Acres for support.

Kevin immediately began receiving mental health services and Therapeutic Behavioral Services (TBS) through our Community Based Program. Kevin and his grandparents have been actively participating in individual and family therapy, improving the family relationship and their well-being. Kevin is also receiving TBS at school, helping him manage his behaviors in the classroom.

With the help of our treatment team, Kevin is showing improvements and his grandparents are feeling less overwhelmed with caring for him, strengthening the family bond and allowing the family to remain together.

## permanency

Five Acres continues to show success in achieving permanency for the children we serve.

The average length of service for our intervention programs is 5.6 months. For children who have been impacted by abuse and neglect, we improve their well-being and find permanent, loving homes in the community.

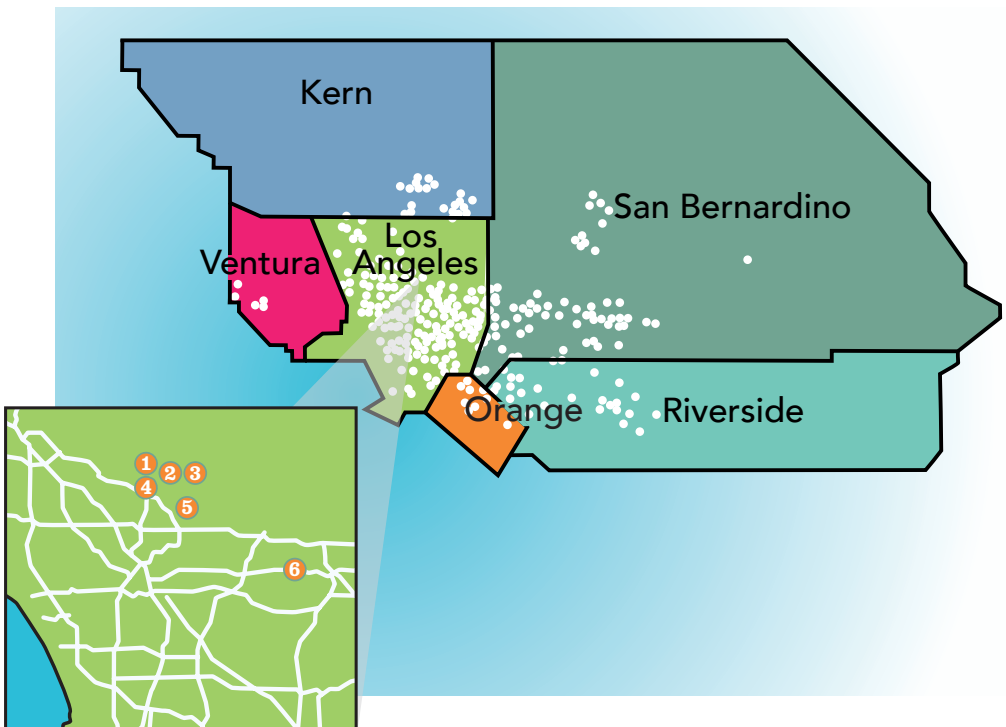

# expanding your commitment

The 2018 Volunteering in America report found that 77.34 million adults (30.3 percent) volunteered through an organization in the previous year. Of those who volunteered, 6,456,628 Generation Y volunteers contributed roughly 474.6 million hours of service. So it was no surprise when young professionals like Annie Hu and MaryAnn White stepped up to expand their commitment in the community by becoming the co-presidents of Five Acres’ new volunteer support group, The Alliance.

The founding members of The Alliance want to engage with other young professionals from San Gabriel Valley and beyond and involve them with Five Acres to focus on creating life skills-focused activities for Los Angeles’ foster youth. “By focusing our membership on young adults,” said Annie, who is the marketing director for the US Marketing team at Joico,

“With each new member, there is an abundance of life experiences that will only make our life skills-focused events with the foster youth that much better!” said MaryAnn, who is a financial advisor and corporate accounts director at Quintus Investment Counsel.

Both Annie and MaryAnn have shared their vision for what The Alliance can be for its members and the kids being served. The vision is for The Alliance to become a long-standing volunteer group within Five Acres, such as the agency’s Children’s Guild, and exist as a robust volunteer group for the next 100+ years to become a well-known, impactful volunteer

group initially within the Pasadena/Altadena area and potentially beyond.

“I want The Alliance to make a positive impact on the lives of the foster youth at Five Acres, with the hopes one day they will understand that there was a group of young adults who cared for them and want them to succeed in everything that they do,” said Annie, who acknowledges that members create moments of joy and positivity for the kids.

“My hope is that every interaction and event from The Alliance leaves a positive lasting impact. What I truly love is seeing those candid moments where the kids are working together, uplifting each other and don’t even realize that we’ve noticed!” said MaryAnn, who recalled one of the kids lit up with the biggest grin when they received a compliment from a fellow kid for their role in making a meal during a cooking class.

Annie shares the same experience when seeing the foster kids get excited at every event The Alliance plans. “Being pulled away from your family no matter what the reason is difficult, and I feel that anything we can do to help make life just a bit easier and filled with more laughter is a good thing,” said Annie.
